

## **Wallaroo Golf Club – Regulations**

*For the benefit of all golfers, the following regulations govern the use of the facilities at the Wallaroo Golf Club. These regulations are subject to change at any time and without prior notice.*

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## WALLAROO GOLF CLUB INC

**Regulation 1** in accordance with Clause 32.1 of Club's Constitution

### 1. Categories of Members

In accordance with Clause 5.1 of the Club's Constitution, the Club has members of the following categories: -

- Life members
- Life Members - Non Playing
- Club members
- Restricted members
  - A – Summer (1st Oct to 31st March)
  - B - Non Competition Days
- Student members
- Junior members
- Temporary members
- Honorary members

### 2. Members

#### 2.1 Life Members:

- a) Life members are those persons who:- Held the category of Life Membership on the adoption of the Constitution or being, or having been, a full Club Member who rendered conspicuous service to the Club and it is on the recommendation of the Committee, elected a Life Member of the Club by the Club general meeting, or by Circulating Resolution of the majority of club members.
- b) Life Members shall have all of the privileges of a Club member but shall not be liable to pay the annual subscription or other charges levies or calls payable by a Club members, and is responsible to pay the Wallaroo Community Club Social Membership, if they desire to be such a member.

#### 2.2 Life Members - Non Playing:

- a) Life Members - Non Playing shall not exceed the total of ten (10) living members at any one time. They will have all of the privileges of a Club member; but shall not be liable to pay the annual subscription or other charges levies or calls payable by Club members, and is responsible to pay the Wallaroo Community Club Social Membership, if they desire to be such a member.

#### 2.3 Club Members: Club Members are those persons who: - held the category of full membership on the adoption of this constitution

Or

being of the age eighteen years were on application admitted to that category of membership by the Committee and paid the entrance fee annual subscription and other charges from time to time fixed at the Annual General Meeting.

**2.5 Restricted Members – there are two classes:-**

- (a) A Members: are Summer Members having membership rights to the club house and golf course between the 1st October and the 31st March the following year AND shall have no voting rights. (Includes persons being of the age of eighteen years who on application are admitted to the above category of membership). The entrance fee for this category is fixed by the Committee and presented to the AGM.
- (b) B Members: covers the whole of the golf season, has membership rights to the clubhouse and shall be eligible to play on the course on days other than the days of competition nominated by the Committee, and shall have no voting rights.

**2.6 Student Members**

Student members are those persons who:-

- a) held the category of Student member or on the adoption of this constitution and have completed three (3) cards of 105 strokes or less to be eligible to partake in the nominated competition and shall have no voting rights.

Or

- b) being under the age of eighteen years are on application and being of a full time student at a school of education are admitted to the category of Student Member - and pay the entrance fee annual subscription or other charges from time to time recommended by the Committee to the AGM and have completed three (3) cards of 105 strokes or less to be eligible to partake in the nominated competition and membership rights to the club house and shall have no voting rights.

**2.7 Junior Members:**

- a) Junior members are those persons who:- held the category of Junior member or on the adoption of this constitution and have completed three (3) cards of 105 strokes or less to be eligible to partake in the nominated competition and shall have no voting rights.

Or

- b) being under the age of eighteen years are on application admitted to the category of Junior member and pay the entrance fee annual subscription or other charges from time to time fixed by the Committee held the category of Junior member or on the adoption of this constitution and have completed three (3) cards of 105 strokes or less to be eligible to partake in the nominated competition and shall have no voting rights.

## 2.8 **Temporary Members:**

On application the Committee may admit the following persons as temporary members on such terms and conditions as the Committee determines:-

- (a) Persons participating in a golf competition being conducted on the course of the Club under auspices of the Committee.
- (b) The predominant number of persons who are members of the association and organisations that have been given permission by a resolution of the Committee of Management to play the course of the Club and who are present for that purpose shall compete in that competition.
- (c) Members of golf clubs with which the Wallaroo Golf Club has reciprocal agreements in respect of playing rights throughout the winter season only.
- (d) Persons who are permitted to use the course of the Club and who have paid the appropriate green fee. Unless otherwise determined by the Committee the period temporary membership of the Club shall not extend one (1) day. The Committee shall have the right at any time to refuse a person admission to temporary membership conferred and shall not be bound to ascribe any reason for so doing. A temporary member shall pay such subscription as the Committee determines from time to time and shall have no voting rights.

## 2.9 **Honorary Members:**

- a) Distinguished citizens may on the invitation of the Committee be admitted as honorary members of the Club for such periods or as such occasions as it may determine. Only 10 such persons may be admitted at any one time.
- b) An Honorary member shall have all the privileges of a Club member but shall not be liable to pay the annual subscription or other charges levies or calls payable by a Club Member

## WALLAROO GOLF CLUB INC

**Regulation 2** in accordance with Clause 32.1 of Club's Constitution

### **Composition of General Committee**

1. The members holding the following nine (9) positions shall be the elected members of the General Committee: -
  - President (of the Club)
  - Vice President
  - Secretary
  - Treasurer
  - Grounds Manager
  - Men's Captain
  - Ladies Captain
  - Ladies President
  - Promotions Manager
  
2. In accordance with Clause 12.1 of the Club Constitution, the General Committee has the power to appoint up to three (3) additional members as Appointed Committee Members. Such Appointed Committee Members may (but not necessarily) be from the following Administrative positions in the Club
  - Plus 3 Committee Members
  - Match Committee Representative
  
3. In accordance with Clause 16 of the Club Constitution, the General Committee has the power to appoint sub-committees.
  
4. The Committee from time to time may delegate to sub-committees which may or may not comprise of a Committee member
  
5. The operations and all functions of sub-committees appointed shall be governed by procedures approved by the Committee and or in accordance with RSO (Yorke Peninsula Group Golf Association Inc.) & SSO (Golf South Australia Inc)
  
- 6.

**Notes to assist interpretation only – not part of the Regulation**

1. All positions must be nominated, notified and elected in accordance with the Constitution.
2. Special timing provisions have been made in the Constitution to allow for the practical election and notification of the Ladies Committee positions (Ladies President and Ladies Captain) but all such positions must be still be subject to Clause 11 of the Constitution and be put to the vote of all Club members if more than one member stands for that Elected Member position.
3. The first listed 4 positions (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer) can be either male or female.
4. If one Club Member holds more than one (1) of the 7 positions on the General Committee in accordance with clause 1 of this Regulation, the Constitution provides that an additional elected member shall be nominated.

## WALLAROO GOLF CLUB INC

**Regulation 3** in accordance with Clause 32.1 of Club's Constitution

### **Ladies Committee – Rules, regulations and adopted conventions**

7. In accordance with Clause 32.1.(b) of the Club's Constitution, the female members of the Club shall have their own Committee comprising the following positions:
  - o President
  - o Vice President
  - o Captain
  - o Vice Captain
  - o Secretary
  - o Assistant Secretary
  - o Handicap Manager
  - o Assistant Handicap Manager
  - o Catering Manager
  - o Up to three (3) Ladies Committee members.
  - a) For continuity of knowledge in running the Committee, it is advisable that the Ladies President and Ladies Captain stagger their term by not starting on the same year.
8. All Committee positions shall be elected positions and such elections shall be conducted in accordance with clauses 11.1 through 11.4 of the Club Constitution
9. A quorum for the Committee meetings shall be half the Committee plus one
10. Frequency of Committee meetings
  - a) Meetings shall be held monthly throughout the year.
  - b) Meetings shall be held at least monthly during the Winter Golf Season
11. General Meetings
  - a) Two main general meetings per year – one at start of Winter season, the other immediately prior to the Club's AGM in order to meet the obligation to submit nominations to the Committee election process in accordance with clause 11.2 of the Club's Constitution.
  - b) Other Ladies General Meetings can be called as necessary by the Ladies Committee or by a majority of female Members
12. After the election at the Ladies General Meeting, the names of the Ladies President, Ladies Vice President, Ladies Captain, and Ladies Vice Captain must be submitted to the Club Committee 24 hours prior to the Club's Annual General Meeting.

## WALLAROO GOLF CLUB INC

**Regulation 4** in accordance with Clause 32.1 (a) of Club's Constitution

### Conditions of Play – Men's Events and Competitions

**Local Rules:** As per Regulation 7

#### Days of Competition / Play

Winter:

- Club Day is Saturday hit off at 12 noon
- Club Day is Wednesday hit off at 12 noon
- An 18 hole comp fee applies of \$5, a 9 hole comp fee of \$3 applies
- Competition of the day is advertised in the Wallaroo Golf programme
- A sharing of Stroke, Stableford and Par rounds comps
- Captain and Vice Captain do the comp club draw
- Members and visitors to fill out their own cards and present them to the Captain by 11:45am
- Captain to allocate different playing partners each week
- Captain to allocate different starting tees
- No Competition can be held with less than 8 players and then only one division
- Competition overall winner receives a donated members trophy which is presented at the end of the seasons presentation evening (value \$25-\$30). Winner of each grade will receive 2 balls. Winners of the Long Drives and the Nearest to Pin receive a ball.

Summer:

- Club Day is Saturday hit off at 12 noon
- Club Day is Wednesday hit off at 8:30am
- Competition of the day is advertised in the Wallaroo Golf programme
- A sharing of Stroke, Stableford and Par rounds comps
- Competition overall winner of each grade receives a prize of Captains discretion. Winners of the Long Drives and the Nearest to Pin receive a ball.

**Canadian Foursome:** Two combined handicaps divided by 3/8. Individual Handicaps to be shown on card. Both players play tee shots at each hole and afterwards continue with which ever ball they nominate, with the partner playing the second stroke and alternating each stroke thereafter.

**Pinehurst Foursome:** Two combined handicaps divided by 3/8. Individual Handicaps to be shown on card. Both players play tee shots at each hole, then play a second stroke with their partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds with the owner of the ball playing the third shot.

**Ambrose:** A team stroke event usually played by a group of four, but can be any number. Each player plays a tee shot at each hole. The team captain then selects the best drive and each team member plays a shot from that position. This procedure of selecting the best position continues until the ball is holed.

Three players 1/6 of combined handicap.

Four players 1/8 of combined handicap.

Five players 1/10 of combined handicap.

**Ames Ambrose:** As above but each players drive must be used once on each nine

**Stroke Competitions:** Stableford points must also be recorded on the cards in these competitions for handicapping purposes.

**Par Competitions:** Stableford points are not required to be recorded on the cards for handicapping purposes.

**Eclectic:** Is the lowest score obtained on each hole throughout the winter season. Total score for the holes is subject to deduction of ½ of the players handicap. Must be marked by playing partner. Trophy Donated by: Nominated donor arranged by the Captain. Trophy to be collected in time for the presentation evening.

**Club Consistency Trophy:** A Player must play in at least half of the programmed events. Trophy Donated by: Nominated donor arranged by the Captain. Trophy to be collected in time for the presentation evening.

**Captain's Stableford Trophy:** Best 2 out of 3 rounds. Captain to keep Record of scores. Trophy donated by Club Captain.

**President's Par Trophy:** Best 2 out of 3 rounds, Captain to keep Record of scores. Trophy donated by Club President. .

**Club Championships:** Best two scores out of 3 stroke rounds used for qualifying. Lowest 8 gross scores in each grade qualify for Match Play Knock-Out round over 18 holes. Final played over 36 holes. Positional ties to be decided by lowest round score. Players unavailable can be replaced with qualified player before 10am on the day of the 1<sup>st</sup> Knock-Out Round. A redraw will be processed by the Match Committee. To allow for ties, all players must tee-off before 12:15pm for the final qualifying round. Players to be at the Club by 11:30am. Trophies to be awarded to the top qualifiers in each grade. Trophy Donor: Club for A, B & C Grade Champions & all Top Qualifier trophies

**Club Aggregate Trophy:** Best Aggregate Stableford score from 4 of 7 rounds

**Eagles Nest.** For Winter & Summer seasons and in individual competition only.

**Course Record:** Can be recognised in a stableford, par or stroke round. Card to be signed by player & marker. Strokes to be recorded for each stableford & par rounds. Player must be a Financial Member of a club and hold an Australian Golfink Number.

**Match Committee:** To comprise of three members. Usually but not necessarily the Handicapper, Captain and President. If one person holds two of these positions, then another member shall be sought. **\*NB\* These three are to be elected at the A.G.M.**

**GE Lawson Memorial Trophy:** Two qualifying rounds of handicap (limit 30). Lowest 8 nett scores qualify for knock-out handicap match play over 18 holes. Finals to be played over 36 holes. Captain to confirm with Owner or the Family every year to confirm Sponsorship of this competition.

Winner Trophy Donor: Owner or family of the Competition

Runner-up Trophy Donor: Owner or family of the Competition

Top Qualifying Trophy Donor: Owner or family of the Competition



Wallaroo Hardware Trophy: Best Aggregate Nett Stroke Score. 4 of 7 stroke rounds. Captain to confirm with Sponsor every year to confirm Sponsorship of this competition.

**Wallaroo and Port Broughton Annual Presidents Shield:** Stableford competition; 12 players of 8 Men and 4 Women to be played at alternate venue yearly commencing in Wallaroo in 2016. Host Club to purchase and engrave winners plaque to add to the Shield. To be played within the Winter season around mid April or whenever it suits both clubs by mutual agreement.

**Allcoast Golf Cars Challenge Shield Wallaroo and Balaklava Annual Competition:** Team Stableford to be played at alternate venue yearly commencing in Balaklava in 2016. Open to men and ladies held over 2 Sundays. An average 18 hole Stableford score being determined by the addition of each clubs players individual Stableford score divided by the number of the clubs players on the day. This result is then added to the second annual competition day result, with the highest total of the two scores being the Shield winner for the year. Allcoast Golf Cars will provide the Challenge Shield at the commencement of this competition in 2016 and will sponsor each Shield competition day thereafter with prizes to individual players (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>) with a prize also to the highest Stableford points scored by a lady. The Shield will be retained by the winning club for 12 months. Each hosting club will charge a \$20 fee for each player to cover lunch (including tea/coffee) and green fees for the day. Other refreshments are at players own cost.

**Disputes, Disqualifications:** To be handled by the Match Committee and according to the rules of golf.

**Caddies:** Allowed in all competitions

**Holes in one on Honour board:** To be recorded on the Honour board. A hole in one must have been achieved during a programmed competition

**Mobile Phones:** The use of mobile phones is restricted: phones must be on silent and phone conversations must not occur during play unless it is an emergency.

**Notes to assist interpretation only – not part of the Regulation**

1. The men have not historically had written Conditions of Play but have relied on generally accepted conventions.
2. Men's competition days are Wednesday and Saturday and the course is available for a female member's competition on Saturdays in summer in conjunction and at the same programmed time as the Men members. At other times female members may play at the end of the Men's competition field (for social play) or in a block of tee times before or within the Men's times if a Ladies competition has been organised and names submitted to the Men's organiser for the day at or before the appointed time. Similarly, men may play on Tuesdays using this approach. Remember the object is to get more members playing golf more often, which also adds to the social life of the Club.

**Regulation 5** in accordance with Clause 32.1 (b) of Club's Constitution.

**Local Rules:** As per Regulation 7

### **Conditions of Play – Ladies Events and Competitions**

#### **Program subject to alteration at discretion of Match Committee**

#### **13. Days of Competition / Play**

- Ladies, Winter Club Day is Tuesday hit off at 9:30am
- Ladies Summer Club Day is Tuesday hit off at 8:30am due to summer conditions; time is flexible according to temperature forecast the night before.
- Competition of the day is advertised in the Wallaroo Golf programme.
- A sharing of Stroke, Stableford and Par rounds comps
- No Competition can be held with less than 4 players and then only one division. Winter competition overall winner receives a voucher, winner of each division will have a choice of 2 balls or a WGC coffee mug. Weekly winners of the Long Drives and the Nearest to Pin receive a ball.
- Fees: An 18 hole comp fee applies of \$5, a 9 hole comp fee of \$3 applies
- Captain and Vice Captain do the weekly draw,
  - i. Captain to allocate different playing partners each week.
  - ii. Captain to allocate different starting tees.

#### **14. Stroke rounds**

- Weekly trophy given in 2 divisions best Nett score.

#### **15. Stableford rounds**

- Full handicap is to be used
- Weekly trophy / voucher given in 2 divisions for the best Stableford score.

#### **16. Par rounds**

- Full Handicap is to be used
- Weekly trophy / voucher given in 2 divisions for the best Par score.

#### **17. Foursomes match play**

All foursomes players must have their individual handicaps on top of card. Strokes given, using the Match Index.

#### **18. Handicap match play**

- The difference of the two handicaps is to be given by the lower handicapper, stated on the Match Index of the Wallaroo Score Cards

#### **19. Club Championships**

- Qualifying rounds;

Every stroke round programmed in the Ladies Program before the end of July is a qualifying round for the Club Championships.

Players must play a minimum of 3 championships rounds to qualify.

Whatever grade a player is in at the end of July will determine which grade of club championships the player qualifies in.

The Match Committee decide the championship handicap divisions for A, B & C Grade Club Championship after the number of qualifiers is finalised.

For qualifying championship rounds golfers are drawn together in there Grades i.e. A; B; & C Grades.

Tees used for qualifying championship rounds are No 1; No 6 & No 10 and are rotated equally between the A; B; & C grade for the qualifying rounds.

- Top eight (8) in each division qualify.
- In the case of a tie, then last card played is used for position in the eight, Except for the 8th position.
- Players involved in a play off (in the event of a tie in the final eight) will play on a day agreeable to themselves before the quarterfinals. In the event of same scores after 18 holes then it is Sudden Death.
- In the case of a tie, then last card played is used for position in the eight, Except for the 8th position.
- If tied, the last card to be used, during Championship rounds, using Gross Score.
- If there is still a tie use the last nine holes, of the last card using the Gross score, and so on till a result.
- Caddies are allowed for Championship Finals
- Advisable for Captain or substitute with good knowledge of golf rules to act as referee for Grand Finals
- Match Play applies to quarter finals, semi finals and the Grand Final

**20. Top Qualifier in each grade receives a WGC Coffee Mug**

- To be eligible for this trophy, player must play in the match play competition of the Club Championship
- If two or more players record the same gross total, then a count back using the last card used.
- If still a tie a count back over the last 9, then 6, and 3 from the last gross score, card being used.

**21. Champion of Champions – (YP District)**

- The Club pays the entrance fee for their Champion to play in the 27 holes Champion of Champions but NOT the A Grade Salver.

**22. A, B and C Grade Salvors**

- To be played at the same club on the same day as the Champion of Champion Event.
- Played as in the District Events Folder.

**23. Disputes**

To be settled by the Match Committee, if unable to find a solution, consult with The SA Golf Association.

**24. Hole in One**

- Club to Supply Hole in One Trophy
- To be recorded on the Honour board, a hole in one must have been achieved during a programmed competition.

**25. Club Course Record**

- Can be recognised on a Stroke, Stableford or Par Competition.
- Must have completed the 18 holes.
- The card has been signed by both the player and partner confirming the result.
- The course record holder must be a Financial Member of a Club.
- In the event of an equal score to the existing course record, they become joint record holders. Both being displayed.
- In the event of the course having alterations, a new course record is required, but the old cards from past years are still to be displayed.

**26. Teams Event. Nett Score**

- 5 players per Team. \$40 per team or \$8 per player to be paid by players home club and paid to the Host Club.
- Clubs may enter 2 Teams.
- Pick players who are consistently playing to their handicaps.

**27. Open days**

- Wallaroo Ladies may hold a two (2) day event, an 18-hole stroke event, and an 18-hole Canadian foursome event on consecutive days or a one day event combining both an Open Day Championship 18 hole event and an 18 hole Foursome programmed usually in late May.
- Club Secretary must apply to Y.P Ladies Golf District Committee for dates.
- Yorke Peninsula District hold their Open Days on Thursday.

**28. Pennants** and interclub matches are played on Thursday and start at 9.30am and 10am;

- Participating Clubs take it in turns to be host Club and prepare the draw
- At the moment 2016 Pennants Team consist of 5 person Teams.
- Match's played on Handicap Match play, using full handicaps.
- Two of these players must have handicaps under 27

**29. Match Committee:**

Captain, Vice Captain, Handicap Manager, President & Secretary

- Roles of a Match Committee
  - i. Monitoring and reviewing events and programmes.
  - ii. Competitions and conditions of play
  - iii. Helping Captain with Annual Programme
  - iv. Implement and maintain procedure Manual
  - v. Knowledge of Rules and Technical aspects
  - vi. Help Captain with Open Days, Pennants & Teams Days with Cards, Draws etc.

vii. Be available to help Captain for any play disputes on rulings etc.

**30. Country Week**

No trophy matches are to be programmed during Country week as it is a Golf SA State programme event.

**31. Veterans**

65 years of age by 1<sup>st</sup> January

**32. 9 Hole Competition**

- Trophy of a ball with Minimum of 2 players playing the front or back nine hole.
- Must use Tee No. 1 for front nine, and Tee No. 10 for back nine, for handicap reasons.
- Handicapping over 2 rounds.

**33. Presidents Par Trophy**

- Best out 2 out of 3 Par rounds
- Captain to keep Record of scores.

**34. Captain's Stableford Trophy**

- Best 2 out of 3 rounds
- Captain to keep Record of scores.

**35. Ethel Taylor's Plate**

Perpetual WGSA Silver Tray (original tray donated in 2007 by Golf SA for Ladies Centenary) played for over 4 stroke rounds with a final play off, winners name engraved on Silver plate and small replica presented as part of trophy

**36. Mary Smibert Perpetual Silver Tray and Pin** (original tray & pin donated by family)

Trophy awarded for Consistency points over the winter season. Each week the following points are awarded: 5 points for 1<sup>st</sup>, 4 points for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3 points for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2 points for 4<sup>th</sup> and 1 point for 5<sup>th</sup>. No count back is involved; all equal scores receive equal points. Winner's names engraved on Silver Tray and the Golf pin is held for 12 months and a voucher from Club accompanies this trophy.

**37. McGorman Family Perpetual Trophy** – (originals donated by Marg McGorman) Best off Stick

- 1st and 2nd Division
- Names engraved on trophies and vouchers presented from Club

**38. Club Championship Handicap Foursomes**

- Draw and dates to be played on are all listed in Ladies program by match committee, winners receive vouchers from Club

**39. Club Medal - purchased by Club**

- Lowest net score of each month qualifies
- Final play off – winner receives small specific medal purchased by club

- 40. Glad Lawson Perpetual Board (original board donated by Glad Lawson family)**
- Held over 3 specified and programmed stableford rounds
  - Final play off
  - Name engraved on Glad Lawson Perpetual Board and winner receives a voucher supplied by the club.
- 41. Seasonal Eclectic**
- Is each players lowest score obtained on each hole throughout the season. Total score for the holes is subject to deduction of ½ (half) the players handicap.**
- 18 & 9 hole competition
  - Must be marked by playing partner.
  - All Tuesday cards can be used for Eclectic.
  - Incomplete cards are eligible for eclectic by putting out in a Stableford or Par competition and card MUST BE SIGNED.
- 42. Putting Competition – one division**
- Best 3 rounds out of 5 programmed.
- 43. International Bowl (3 rounds)**
- Local District
    - i. The lowest nett score recorded from any of the three rounds.
    - ii. 1 round played is eligible
    - iii. Copy of results SENT to DISTRICT SECRETARY. Best Nett score from the Yorke Peninsula Division receives the Ina Thyer foursomes trophy presented at the Kadina Golf Club Open Day.
  - State – all players
    - i. A single entry fee of \$2.50 entitles a player to return up to 3 cards on current handicap on all three days.
  - Silver Section 0-18.4 handicap
    - i. The lowest 2 nett cards from any of the 3 rounds
    - ii. Winners receive State International Bowl Badge from Golf SA
    - iii. Results sent on Official Golf SA Form to Adelaide and hard copies kept by golf club Captain in case needed by Golf SA.
  - Bronze Section 18.5-45.4 Handicap
    - i. As above
- 44. Laurel Wreath**
- Entry Fee \$2.50 to be paid to GSA.
  - Players must be financial to be eligible for Laurel Wreath.
  - Drawn handicap Match Play on current handicap.
  - To be played by rules set down by GA in brochure.
  - One division only
  - Laurel Wreath to be played on the day programmed then played on days as officially programmed.
  - Must hold a current GA handicap.
  - First match to be played on a Tuesday club day.
  - Each progressive round to be played as already programmed by match committee.

- If all square after 18 holes play – Sudden Death with handicap still to apply. If all square in Final – Sudden Death with handicap still in play.
- 45. Shylie Rymill Foursomes in conjunction with Mrs Ina Thyer Foursomes**
- Entry Fee \$2.50 per pair
  - Played as Handicap Foursomes, the winning pair records the lowest nett score in relation to DSR. In the event of a Tie a count-back will apply.
  - Both 1st and 2nd Shylie Rymill results are sent to Golf SA on their official forms and a \*Copy of winner of Mrs Ina Thyer Foursomes to the District Secretary.
  - MUST HAVE DSR ON CARDS.
  - Badges supplied by Golf SA
- 46. The Mrs Ina Thyer Foursomes is run in conjunction with ShylieRymill Foursomes**
- This salver is presented at the Kadina-Foursomes day to the pair who achieves the best nett score, in relation to the course rating in the Shylie Rymill Foursomes competition in the YP District.
  - The Salver is kept at the players' home club but must be returned to the Kadina Club prior to the next Kadina Foursomes day.
  - For players to be eligible for this Salver, Clubs must send a \*written copy (Not Photocopy) of the original score card to the District Secretary 7 days before the Kadina Foursomes Day and it must be signed by the players with their individual handicaps shown and the DSR for the day.
- 47. Canadian Foursomes**
- Two combined handicaps divided by 3/8
  - Individual handicaps to be shown on Card.
- 48. Pinehurst Foursomes**
- Two combined handicaps divided by 3/8
  - Individual Handicaps to be shown on card.
- 49. Stableford and Par**
- Use full handicap and stroke index
- 50. Ambrose Competition**
- 4 players – highest handicap hits off first.
  - Then select the best ball and take the remaining three balls to the position of the best ball.
  - All drop or place and hit from as near as possible to that best ball.
  - Continue until you hole the ball.
  - Divide by 8 to get the best net.
  - Divide by 10 if there are 5 players in team.
  - Divide by 6 if there are 3 players in team.
  - All individual handicaps must be shown on card

**51. 9 Hole Ambrose**

- GOOD COMPETITION FOR FIRST DAY OF THE SEASON
- Divide number of girls into teams of three.
- Play holes No. 1 - 9
- Make a list of players in handicap order 1 – 45
- New players drawn with the lowest handicappers
- Start with lowest handicap and allocate one per group required.
- Then start with highest handicap and allocate one per group.
- Then next highest handicap and allocate one per group.
- Continue until there are 3 players per group.
- To get team handicap:
- For teams of 4 – Divide aggregate handicap by 16
- For teams of 5 – Divide aggregate handicap by 20
- For teams of 3 – Divide aggregate handicap by 12
- All Individual handicaps to be shown on cards.

52. Each winter season Golf SA supplies official forms for the Captain to supply the Shylie Rymill and the International Bowl results on. Original Scorecards are not sent to Golf SA in Adelaide anymore. Captain keeps the original and if asked to, scans cards and sends them down. A copy of the card for the Ina Thyer Trophy is sent to the YP District Ladies Secretary.

53. Mobile Phones: The use of mobile phones is restricted: phones must be on silent and phone conversations must not occur during play unless it is an emergency.

**Notes to assist interpretation only – not part of the Regulation.**

1. The Ladies have historically had written Conditions of Play and these have been supported by decisions recorded in the minutes of the Ladies Committee. The above Conditions of Play have been drafted based on the existing Ladies written Conditions of Play.
2. Ladies competition day is Tuesday but the course is available to male members at the end of the Ladies competition field (for social play) . Ladies play in their own organised competition on Saturdays in the summer season. Remember the object is to get more members playing golf more often which also adds to the social life of the club.



## **WALLAROO GOLF CLUB INC**

**Regulation 6** in accordance with Clause 16 & 32.1 of Club's Constitution

### **Administrative Matters**

#### **Committees**

1. All Committee Meeting agendas shall be circulated at least 48 hours prior to each meeting to provide the opportunity for all Committee members time to research, consider and assess matters being raised
2. Committee members wishing to raise matters at a meeting should make the matter known to the President and Secretary in order that the matter is placed on the agenda. Matters, particularly if urgent, may still be raised at Committee meetings
3. Sub Committees may be formed from time to time as delegated by the Committee
4. Sub Committees may not necessarily comprise of the members of the Committee

#### **Financial Reports**

1. Clause 21 (c) of the Club's Constitution requires the circulation of the audited financial statements with the agenda for the Annual General Meeting.
2. To keep the Committee fully aware of the club's financial position, unaudited statements of income and expenditure should be presented to the Committee quarterly in addition to bank balances. Every effort should be made to also provide statements representing the contribution to the overall financial position from major activities such as, subscriptions, sponsorship, catering, functions, fundraising and bar profits.

#### **Men**

1. Men's Captain & committee is responsible for preparing the annual programme in conjunction with the Ladies' Captain and committee.
2. Men's Captain runs the men's competitions and special combined days such as Season opening
3. Men's regular standard competition fees will be paid by all competitors on the day of play. Currently \$5 for an 18 hole comp and \$3 for a 9 hole comp.
4. Standard competition prizes such as glasses, balls or any other item by agreement shall be covered by the daily competition fees without subsidy from Club funds
5. The Club will pay the entrance fees of the player(s) representing the Club at the Champion of Champions competition if such a request is made to the Committee. The entrance fees for all other "team" events such as the West End teams day will be on a user pays basis.
6. End of Season prizes such as all Club Championship Trophies are covered by club funds. Saturday winter competition weekly trophies are currently donated by club members before the season begins.

#### **Ladies**

1. Ladies duties – as per Regulation 5.
2. Ladies' Captain & committee to work together with the Men's Captain to prepare the annual programme
3. Ladies regular standard competition fees are \$5 for an 18 hole comp and \$3 for a 9 hole comp.
4. The entrance fees for the Ladies SA Golf Events (currently Laurel Wreath, International Bowl and Shylie Rymill & Mrs Thyer Foursomes) shall be paid by the competitors on a user pays basis are the responsibility of the Club.
5. The Club will pay the entrance fees of the player(s) representing the Club at the Champion of Champions competition.

## WALLAROO GOLF CLUB INC

**Regulation 7** in accordance with Clause 32.1 of Club's Constitution

### Local Rules

**(To be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and the Australian Golf Union Local Rules for Sand Greens.)**

1. **Hazards:** Dam on Number 7 and lakes on number 5 and 8 are defined water hazards
2. **Out of Bounds:** All country outside the boundary fence surrounding the course is out of bounds and car park.
3. **Preferred Lie:** A ball lying on the fairway of the hole being played, including the fairway mark, may be cleaned and placed, once only within one club length, not nearer the hole, without penalty.
4. **Scraping:** When the ball lies on the putting surface or within one club length of putting surface the player is allowed a maximum of two smooths per putt. The smooth shall continue at least one club length beyond the hole and each smooth is to be in reverse order. Where the rake is provided it shall be used for a smooth only.
5. **Trees:** If a staked or protected tree or shrub interferes with a players stance or the area of his intended swing, the player **MUST** take a relief provided in Rule 24.2a.
6. **Relief:** A ball on a roadway or in a wheel track, or any disturbance of soil caused by stock or machinery may be lifted in accordance with Rule 24b.
7. **Sprinklers around putting surfaces:** If a ball strikes a sprinkler around putting surfaces the ball **MUST** be replayed without penalty.
8. **Relief from Sport Complex Building:** If the sporting complex building interferes with a player's stance or the area of their intended swing, the player must take relief as provided in Rule 24.2a. In addition to the above, relief from the Sporting Complex where the metal road is present on the western end, the tank, the gas tank and the surrounds and the metal road: is to be taken within two club lengths of the white peg marked boundary on the golf course side, not nearer the hole.
9. Any ball on the putting surface where any abnormal ground condition on the edge of the black scrape interferes with players intended swing the ball may be lifted and placed at the nearest point of relief which may be off the putting surface.
10. GPS units are permitted to be used at the Wallaroo Golf Club
11. **Heat Rule:** Summer Golf Season weekday and Saturday competition days. Golf will be cancelled if the forecast temperature for Kadina is 38 degrees or higher at the Bureau of Meteorology the night before competition days. (If players decide to play at 38 degrees or high it is at their own risk, it is unsanctioned competition and competition fees do not apply.)
12. **Temporary Local Rules:** Refer notice Board

13. Chipping and Putting is allowed on Practice Hole. Scrape must be smoothed at the completion of the practice by the person practicing.

#### **PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES**

MATCH PLAY – Loss of Hole

STROKE PLAY – Two Strokes

#### **Attachment 1 to Regulation 7 re: Local Rules**

##### **Distance Measuring Devices in Competitions**

Distance Measuring Devices – it seems as if every second player on a golf course is using either a stand-alone GPS, a laser or a smart phone app to find out the distance to the green. Almost every club now has in place the Local Rule which allows their use in competition play. The R&A, USGA and Golf Australia now permits the use of DMD's in their amateur competitions (but not yet in any of the Opens), but there still is widespread uncertainty about what is, and what is not allowable in a Distance Measuring Device.

**The most important point is that the device measures distance only.** If it is capable of measuring or gauging other aspects which could guide a player in his play or choice of club, such as angle of approach, wind speed or temperature, it is not permissible, even if the other capabilities are switched off or not used in the round. Most dedicated devices such as stand-alone GPS's and lasers sold to golfers meet this specification, as they measure distances (to green, hazards, OOB) only. Where the legality of DMD's becomes questionable is when they are installed on smartphones. A basic phone, complete with its usual basic apps, with a purchased GPS program for use on a golf course, is permissible. The weather app, which reports on conditions but does not measure them, is legal. The installed compass, which precluded the use of smart-phones in the past, is now permissible, due to a revised Decision on the Rules by the R&A. Any other installed or purchased apps, such as those which measure the break on a green, or provide feed-back on a stroke, or which recommend the use of a particular club for a particular situation, **even if these features are turned off**, make the device illegal.

So the use of the GPS installed on a smart-phone (where the Local Rule allowing DMD's in competition is in place) is allowable. Ultimately, because it is impractical for every smart-phone to be examined by the Committee in charge of a competition, the legal use of a DMD installed on a phone on the golf course is down to the individual golfer.

In its competitions, GolfSA has decided, for the sake of clarity, to allow the use of devices that measure distance only, but not to allow the use of applications on mobile phones. Mobile phones must be switched off on the golf course, and are only to be used in case of emergency.

If a player is uncertain whether a device which he has purchased is allowable in competition, he should approach the Committee, or contact GolfSA.

The R&A has a comprehensive page of advice on its website in the form of a Q&A, with a flow-chart to answer questions on the use of DMD's.
